







III. The Emergence of the Populist Party

 - 6. State legislatures pass anti-monopoly laws
 - 7. "BUY LESS PRODUCE MORE!"








III. The Emergence of the Populist Party

- C. Farmers' Alliance (POPULIST) 1880-90s
 - 1. Militant organization
 - 2. Cooperatives
 - 3. Monopsony
 - 4. Subtreasury Plan
 - 5. "RAISE LESS CORN AND MORE HELL
 - 6. 1891-92, The People's Party (Populist)
 - 7. 1892, 11 representatives to Congress.
 - 8. 1892, Presidential Candidate, James Weaver
 - 9. 1894 sent 40 representatives to Congress








V. The Spanish American War, 1898

- 1. 1875-1900: Age of Imperialism
- 2. After 1890, Many Americans seek Empire/War
 - A. Theodore Roosevelt, Asst. Secretary of Navy
 - B. Alfred Mahan, *Influence of Sea Power* (1890)
- 3. Naval Bases Sought: Hawaii, Puerto Rico, Cuba
- 4. Cuban Independence Movement against Spain, 1895
- 5. Feb 15, 1898: *Maine* exploded in Havana harbor
- 6. Yellow Press: Hearst, NY Journal; Pulitzer, NY World
















Asia, c. 1900




V. The Spanish American War, 1898


- 7. Declaration of War against Spain, April 1898
- 8. Teller Amendment (1898)
- 9. War: less than 4 months and 400 killed
- 10. US received Philippines, Puerto Rico, Guam
- 11. Cuba forced to accept Platt Amendment (1901)
- 12. In addition, in July 1898: Hawaii annexed
- 13. Citizens of subjects?








The White Man's Burden, Judge, 1899
